## WHAT IS A WORTHWHILE LIFE? An Overview of the 7<sup>th</sup> Grade WHO AM I? Project

**COVER SHEET:** Includes title of *Who Am I?*; due date; name; period

SIX-WORD MEMOIR: Assigned in your history class

- 1. **REFLECTION LETTER**: You will be given specifics for this assignment as you near completion of the *Who Am I?* assignment.
- 2. THIS I BELIEVE: a creative statement of what you believe is important.
- 3. **ME!**: a collage that includes a picture of you as well as your choice of visual representations of hobbies, interests, family members, friends, aspirations, and goals for a worthwhile life. The collage features attention to detail, with little white space.
- 4. ENGLISH BIO POEM
- 5. HISTORY SHIELD
- 6. A WORTHWHILE LIFE UPSTANDER: A CNN HERO: your history teacher will give you instructions for this.
- 7. MY NAME: an essay that summarizes the meanings of your first and last names as well as the story of how and why you received your first name. (OPTIONAL: middle, religious, and nicknames)
- 8. MY ROOTS: ("Where I'm From" or "Abuelito Who" imitation poem) a poem of how your family background (culture, religion, ethnicity, foods, rituals, holidays, languages, rules) influences your life.
- 9. **HOW OTHERS SEE ME:** 5 surveys of how people see you (two must be completed by adults). Names and relationship of interviewees are explained; a summary paragraph is also included. What do you think of what others said?
- 10. **HOW I SEE MYSELF:** an *autobiographical narrative* that focuses on a memorable, worthwhile experience.
- 11. **SOCIAL JUSTICE PROBLEM/SOLUTION:** an *informational essay* that informs your reader on a topic of your choice. Includes a "Works Cited" section.
- 12. **MY VIEWPOINT:** an *argument essay*. Either your "Year-Round School" or "Homelessness" essay, or both!
- 13. ME, MYSELF, AND SCIENCE: Your science teacher will give you further details.
- 14. MATH AND ME: Your math teacher will give you further details.
- 15. **FURTHER WRITING** (optional): This may include, but is not limited to: Writer's Workshop material; personal writing such as poems, short stories, and creative written work you have completed for other classes.
